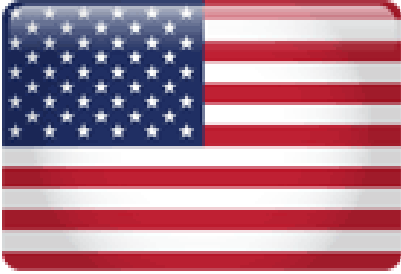


Judges send teenagers to prison for cash
